

Christian Leadership In Christ Alone

Hymn: In Christ Alone 1 Timothy 4:6-12 (ESV) Dave Steane Preaching

day we continue A Faith That Sings, an original sermon series exploring some of the great hymns and songs of our faith. German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther once said, "I have no use for cranks who despise music, because it is a gift of God. Next after theology, I give to music the highest place and the greatest honor." The power of music in Christian worship is both soul stirring and spirit lifting. God speaks personally and powerfully to His people through the singing of songs, which reaffirms His love and strengthens our faith.

During our morning worship today, we are privileged to ordain and install a new class of elders to provide leadership to MDPC's spiritual life and ministries. To be called by God to serve as a Christian leader is a sacred trust. The Apostle Paul was passionate about developing Christian leadership, so he poured himself into a young pastor named Timothy. In 1 Timothy 4:6-12, we find powerful words which can shape our faith and understanding of Christian leadership.

In 2001, Keith Getty and Stuart Townend wrote In Christ Alone. In its relatively short history, this song has become a strong affirmation of faith for Christians, that Jesus Christ alone is our source of salvation and hope. For those in Christian leadership, the centrality of Christ is paramount!

- · In verse six, Paul encouraged Timothy to resist false teaching and to maintain fidelity to God's truth. To do this, Timothy was to be trained in the words of faith and good doctrine. How do you respond when you hear someone teaching a doctrine that is contrary to Christian truth? For you, what are words of faith and good doctrine?
- Paul mentions avoiding *irreverent*, *silly myths*. What are some contemporary examples of these? Why is it a good idea to avoid them?
- One of Paul's favorite teaching illustrations was that the Christian life is like an athlete training his or her body for competition. Paul told Timothy, train yourself for godliness. In what ways do you engage this training? What results do you see? Are there changes needed to your spiritual workout regimen?
- Verse 10 suggests that the reason for our toiling and striving is because our hope is set on the living God. How does this type of hope shape the decisions we make and the actions we take?
- Paul exhorted Timothy in verse 12 to set an example for others in his speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity. In what ways can these five things be used as a positive example to others? How have you experienced this?
