Night Is When the Stars Shine

Hymn: *Abide With Me*

Romans 8:26-39

Howard Edington Preaching

Today we continue *A Faith That Sings*, a sermon series exploring some of the great hymns and songs of our faith. German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther once said, "I have no use for cranks who despise music, because it is a gift of God. Next after theology, I give to music the highest place and the greatest honor." The power of music in Christian worship is both soul stirring and spirit lifting. God speaks personally and powerfully to His people through the singing of songs, which reaffirms His love and strengthens our faith.

Henry Francis Lyte wrote the beloved Christian hymn, *Abide With Me*, in 1874. With very little training, Lyte became an Anglican priest in 1815. A year later, as he attended to a fellow priest who was dying, Lyte experienced a powerful conversion when he discovered the "plain and literal" sense of the epistles of Paul. This radically transformed his life and faith. By 1874, Lyte was dying of tuberculosis and wrote *Abide With Me* just three weeks before his death. The hymn is a prayer asking God to be intimate and close through the hills and valleys of life.

Part of the inspiration for *Abide With Me* may well have been Romans chapter 8:26-39. This passage contains a strong affirmation that Christians are victorious because of God's presence through Jesus Christ. We join our voices with the saints from old as we proclaim that nothing can separate us from God's love!

- Paul said that the Spirit *intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express*. How do you understand this? How have you experienced this? Have you ever been speechless before God?
- Paul said that *in all things God works for the good of those who love Him*. In what ways have you found this to be true? How have you experienced God working for the good during times of trial and struggle in your life?
- *If God is for us, who can be against us?* This is one of the most powerful affirmations in all of scripture! To what extent have you been able to embrace this? What things interfere with living in this confidence? What does it mean that God is for *you*?
- Paul said that *nothing* can separate us from the love of Christ. Even trouble, hardship, persecution, famine, nakedness, or the danger of sword are unable to separate us from Christ's love. How have you experienced that kind of love from Christ? How does believing in this love affect your view of your current circumstances?
- Paul said that Christians are *more than conquerors* through Christ's love. What things have you *conquered* because of this love?
- Paul listed several things that are unable to thwart God's love: death, life, angels, demons, present, future, powers, height, or depth. In what ways might these things try to separate God's love from us? How have you experienced God's abiding love in the face of these things?
