The Trouble With Water

Hymn: Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing

Matthew 14:22-33

Rachel Poysky Preaching

Today we continue *A Faith That Sings*, a sermon series exploring some of the great hymns and songs of our faith. German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther once said, "I have no use for cranks who despise music, because it is a gift of God. Next after theology, I give to music the highest place and the greatest honor." The power of music in Christian worship is both soul stirring and spirit lifting. God speaks personally and powerfully to His people through the singing of songs, which reaffirms His love and strengthens our faith.

Prior to today's passage, Jesus feeds the crowd of 5,000 and then retreats to the mountain to pray. While He is there, a storm arises at sea. So He leaves behind the chaos of the crowd to pray, but when He comes down from the mountain, He encounters the chaos of the storm. Jesus quickly restores peace by being Lord of the storm and rescuing Savior to the disciples. This passage gives us insight into the fear of Peter, the power of staying focused on Jesus, and the glory of God revealed through Jesus Christ.

- Matthew 14:22-23 Jesus retreats to the mountain. In the passages that follow, we see several times that Jesus retreated to pray. It is an example for us to set aside times to retreat and pray. When do you find you need to retreat and spend time with God?
- Matthew 14:24-27 The disciples call out in fear to Jesus and He comforts them with His voice. How do you see Him bringing comfort into your life when you face tough times? How does He speak to you in the storms?
- Matthew 14:28-30 Peter loses his focus and starts to sink. What distracts us and causes us to take our eyes off of Jesus?
 Fear can paralyze us or move us closer to trusting God. Share a time in your life when your fear drew you closer to God and you relied on Him.
- Matthew 14:33 "Truly You are the Son of God!"-When they saw what Jesus had done, it helped them to see Him more clearly. Take a moment to think about other times during the earthly ministry of Jesus when He showed Himself to others in a way that revealed His glory. Read through the following Scriptures to see times when Jesus revealed more of who He is to His people: Matthew 17:1-13, John 2:1-12, John 11:1-44, Acts 1:6-11.

The hymn *Come*, *Thou Fount of Every Blessing* reminds us that we are "Prone to wander" and "Prone to leave the God we love." It is a prayer to God which acknowledges our wandering and asks for help to stay intimately tied to our Savior. Read the words below as a prayer to God for this week.

O to grace how great a debtor daily I'm constrained to be! Let Thy goodness, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to Thee. Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it. Prone to leave the God I love; Here's my heart, O take and seal it. Seal it for Thy courts above. Amen.
