The Greatest Storyteller's Greatest Story

Hymn: Amazing Grace

Luke 15:11-24

Howard Edington Preaching

Today we continue our sermon series entitled, A Faith That Sings. German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther once said, "I have no use for cranks who despise music, because it is a gift of God. Next after theology, I give to music the highest place and the greatest honor." The power of music in Christian worship is both soul-stirring and spirit-lifting. God speaks personally and powerfully to His people through the singing of songs, which reaffirms His love and strengthens our faith.

The centerpiece of Christian theology is the affirmation of God's grace. The word *grace* means *unmerited favor*. By this we mean that God bestows His blessings upon us, not because of anything we've done, but solely because of God's benevolent nature. The Parable of the Great Banquet in Luke 15 is a powerful illustration of the nature of that grace.

A corresponding hymn to this text is John Newton's "Amazing Grace." The hymn is somewhat autobiographical of Newton's life. He had been a wretched person with the most offensive language. He had participated in the slave trades, violating the human rights of countless people. Yet, through a series of events, God transformed John Newton's heart. "Amazing Grace" is arguably the most well-known and beloved Christian hymn. It appears in more than 1,000 different hymnals, and it is estimated that it is sung more than 10 million times annually.

- In verse 11, Jesus said, For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted. In what ways is this statement contrary to humanity's natural way of thinking? How have you seen this statement acted out by others?
- In verses 12-14, Jesus said we should go outside of our circle of friends when planning a banquet, and invite people who are needy. What principles are present in this statement? What prevents us from putting this teaching into action? Who could you invite to your next "banquet?"
- As Jesus told the Parable of the Great Banquet, He described a scene where the invited
 guests all gave excuses for not being able to attend. Reflect on a time when you have
 tried to extend an invitation to someone, only to have that invitation rejected. How
 did you feel? Did you ever invite them again?
- In the parable, the owner of the house shifted the invitation away from the original guests, and instructed his servant to invite the poor, crippled, blind, and lame to attend the great banquet. In its original context, the parable spoke about how Jesus' own people had rejected Him, and how God's grace was extended to people beyond the Jews. Reflect on ways this parable can take on a modern-day ethic. Who are the poor, crippled, blind, and lame for us today?
- God's grace is the foundation of this parable and really the cornerstone upon which
 our Christian faith is built. In what ways do you struggle with God's grace? How have
 you experienced this grace? How can you be an agent of God's grace in the world
 today?
