

Memory Verse: Galatians 2:20



To position text so that the edges form a straight line.

Left Justified

The text is in line with the left-hand margin.

Right Justified

The text is in line with the right-hand margin.


The text is centered between the left and right margins. Balanced text, but ragged edges.

Center Justified


Full Justification

The text is evenly distributed to be in line with both the left and right margins. This provides nice edges to the text, but can create uneven spacing.

To prove to be right




To provide a good reason for your actions



To show a sufficient lawful reason for an action





The law reveals what sin is. The law reveals how unable we are to keep the law and avoid sin.






Paul was concerned about preserving the integrity of the gospel. In Galatians 2:2 he writes that he went to the Jerusalem Council to set before them "the gospel that I proclaim among the Gentiles in order to make sure I was not running or had not run in vain".

1500 years after Paul, the gospel was being compromised by:


- •the sale of relics of the saints
- •indulgences (certificates signed by the pope pardoning sins)
- •pilgrimages to sites associated with the saints.

People believed that these things would assure their salvation.

The one man who re-enacted the experience of Paul was the great reformer, Martin Luther. ~William Barclay
