

30 million people live as slaves today, according to the Walk Free Foundation.


Slavery in this study is defined as:

"What's perhaps most amazing about the prevalence of slavery around the world is how similar it can look across very different societies.



Nationally, 25% of rescued victims are rescued in Texas




# From the Greek allegoria= allos ('other') + agoria ('speaking')

### Paradise


The first four letters of those words are the consonants of the word "Paradise" in Hebrew.

If a rabbi succeeded in penetrating all 4 levels of meaning he reached the joy of paradise.

The highest meaning was the allegorical meaning which Paul, a trained rabbi, is showing to the Galatians.


