Youth Sunday, May 4, 2014



Today is Youth Sunday at MDPC! We believe that one of our greatest responsibilities and privileges is to invest in the next generation of Christians who will carry forward the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Our commitment to this next generation is not just about a token Sunday, but seeks to create an environment where there is mutual respect, engagement, and integration at all times. In a world where the Christian faith fails to "stick" for many youth, particularly as they enter college and/or leave home, we are committed to doing all we can to ensure that a life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ sticks, and strengthens each person's Christian worldview.

Our sermon text today is Psalm 16. It is called a *mitkam* of David. *Mitkam* is a Hebrew word meaning either "writing" or "psalm." Psalm 16 is rich in wisdom and profound theological truth, and is seen as a prayer for safekeeping. As many of our students prepare to begin a new chapter of their lives in college, how appropriate it is for us to be reminded of our dependency on the strength of the God who created us and loves us.

- The Psalm begins with, "Keep me safe, O God, for in You I take refuge." Reflect on a time in your life when you expressed something similar to these words. Is there a situation you're currently facing that has caused you to seek refuge in God?
- In verse two, David affirms, "apart from You (God) I have no good thing." How do you react to this? In what ways is this true or false for you?
- Verse four says, "The sorrows of those will increase who run after other gods." Reflect on what "other gods" might mean for people today. Also, what might this sorrow look like? In what ways have you experienced the truth of this verse?
- The cup metaphor in verse five alludes to the blessings which God bestows upon His children. The language suggests that God has a custom-made set of blessings for each person. What does this reveal about God's nature and character? Reflect on what's in your blessing cup.
- When David refers to the Lord as being at his right hand, he is suggesting that God is his sustainer and protector. In what ways has God been this for you? Are there situations you're currently facing where you need God as your sustainer and protector?
- The final three verses describe the joy David has knowing God's security and protection. Verse eleven notes that God had made known the path of life, and filled David with the joy of God's presence. How do you understand God's path of life for you? In what ways do you experience the joy of God's presence?
