



Winning Isn't Everything, But the Will to Win Is

1 Chronicles 28:1-10 & 2 Chronicles 6:7-9 | Howard Edington Preaching

David rose from humble beginnings to become, arguably, the greatest King in Israel's history. The strength and splendor of Israel was established under David's rule, and God used David's leadership to further God's plan of salvation in Jesus Christ. Though David was godly and successful, he was also a flawed human who struggled to maintain fidelity to God. In this sermon series, we will examine David as a whole person, noting his triumphs and tragedies alike. Today we continue our look at the life of David.

One of the signs of healthy leadership is how that leadership goes through transition. As King David was aging and approaching the end of his reign, one of his goals was to build a grand Temple as a resting place for the Ark of the Covenant. But God had a different plan, one that included David's son, Solomon, as the one who would achieve David's goal.

- 1 Chronicles 28 begins with David summoning all of his officials and officers for a grand announcement. Reflect on a time when someone in authority summoned you to a meeting. What things went through your mind in anticipation? What happened as a result of the meeting?
- David shared his vision for the Temple, but added that God told him "no" because David had shed blood and had been a warrior. Have you ever had a dream of doing something only to be told "no"? How do you resolve the conflict when your will is at odds with God's?
- David reported that God had selected his son, Solomon, to be the heir to Israel's throne. What issues and emotions might have been connected to David as he became aware of God's succession plan? In what ways have you participated in a succession plan?
- David charged those present to "follow the commands of the Lord that they may possess this good land..." David seemed to know that Israel's health and well-being were rooted in adherence to God's commands, and not to the particular vision or personality of Israel's king. What principles do you find in this? How can this be applied to MDPC as we continue our season of transition and search for a new Senior Pastor?
- David's challenge to Solomon was for him to serve God with wholehearted devotion. In what ways have you experienced this type of devotion to God? What were the results?
