SERMON NOTES

The Mission's Still the Same

Acts 2:37-47 | Dave Steane preaching

 ${f M}$ emorial Drive Presbyterian Church is preparing to kick off a new program year with exciting and transformational ministries! What better way to do this than to spend time unpacking MDPC's new Mission Statement: Loving God. Proclaiming Christ. Living Generously. Engaging All.

Before Dave Peterson retired, we began the process of succession planning and developing a Strategic Plan to provide guidance to MDPC through the transition and into the future with a new Senior Pastor. The culmination of that Strategic Plan was identifying our "code" (the very DNA of MDPC that doesn't change), a group of "strategic priorities" (the things we need to do to succeed in the future), and our new "mission statement."

The Christian Church has always had a mission. It began when Jesus told His disciples to "go therefore and make disciples of all the nations..." (Matthew 28:19). It continued as the Book of Acts began, as the infant Church became more self-aware. In Acts 2:37-47, we have a snapshot of that vibrant early Church. The mission to which the early believers were called continues to be the foundation of MDPC's mission today. The Mission's still the same!

- · First things first. Start by committing the eight words of our Mission Statement to memory. Loving God. Proclaiming Christ. Living Generously. Engaging All. In what ways does this Statement reflect the history and beliefs of MDPC? What challenges do you also find in the Statement?
- God's love for us initiates everything about His plan of salvation, and Loving God is our primary response and calling as Christians. What does loving God look like in your life? What do you do to respond to God's love?
- In the Acts passage, Peter just had finished his first sermon in which he offered a compelling argument that Jesus was the Messiah. Verse 37 tells us that the audience was pierced to the heart (convicted of their wrong thinking). Reflect on a time when you've been pierced to the heart. How did you respond?
- In verse 38, Peter told the crowd that they must repent and be baptized. Both acts are powerful redirections. In what way have you experienced this redirection? How do you understand the Christian Church's mission to play a role in this redirection?
- In verse 41, those who received Peter's word were baptized, and about 3,000 people turned to follow Jesus. What do you think made Peter's sermon so compelling? Why do you think people seem to be less inclined to follow Jesus today? What do you think the Church's role should be regarding *Proclaiming Christ*?
- In the next few verses, we find a description of the quality of community life in the early Church: people were devoted to teaching, signs and wonders were happening, people took care of each other, meals were shared in community, and there was favor with all the people. There was a genuine spirit of Living Generously in the early Church. Reflect on some ways these qualities are true for the Church today. In what ways could these be better realized? What can you do specifically to help achieve these?
- These verses also describe a sense of unity within the Christian Church. Verse 44 says they had all things in common. Verse 46 says they were of one mind and were taking their meals together. The Gospel was Engaging All, and drew people into a new community. How have you experienced this? In what ways can the Church do a better job of reaching out across generational lines, and engaging people with the Gospel?
