PAUL'S LETTER TO THE PHILIPPIANS

Sunday, September 7, 2014

Our Life Is What Our Thoughts Make It

Philippians 1:19-26 | Howard Edington preaching

Today we continue our sermon series on Paul's letter to the Philippians. On his second missionary journey, Paul visited Philippi, established the Christian church there, and spent considerable time in that cosmopolitan city. He enjoyed a deep friendship and Christian fellowship with the Philippian Christians, and devoted much effort to helping them to be strong in their faith – especially when facing troubles and persecution.

Philippians has been called Paul's *joyful* letter because the theme of Christian *joy* runs throughout the letter. In just four chapters, Paul reminded the Philippians 16 times that their joy was not determined by circumstances, but by the indwelling presence of Jesus Christ in their life, and in their devotion to Him.

As chapter one continues, the Apostle Paul wrote to express the strange tension he felt between the call to preach the Gospel and to suffer for this, and the attraction to his life ending and enjoying God's peace in heaven.

- We have noted earlier that Paul wrote Philippians during a time of harsh imprisonment. The conditions would have been deplorable. Reflect on a time when you've endured deplorable conditions. How did you respond? What things did you learn? In what ways did you experience God?
- In verse 20 we see Paul's greatest concern: That he would exalt Jesus Christ no matter what the conditions or outcome might be. To what extent do you share that concern in your own life? How have you seen Christ exalted by less than ideal situations?
- Philippians 1:21 is a well-known and inspirational verse: For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. How do you understand what Paul was expressing? In what ways can you identify with Paul's proclamation? What does to live is Christ mean to you? What does to die is gain mean to you?
- Paul was faced with the very real threat of death. As he contemplated this, he
 found himself torn between wanting to keep on living and doing the fruitful labor
 to which he had been called, and wanting to die to be with Christ. What is it about
 physical death that is so scary and something to be avoided? In what ways can you
 identify with this tension?
- Paul noted that the better of the two options was to die and be with Christ. However, his love and concern for the Philippians compelled him to remain alive. Paul set aside what he wanted to do, in order to meet the needs of others. In what ways have you done this? Reflect on examples of other people who have sacrificed their own will for the benefit of others.
- Paul's hope for the Philippians is that their joy in Christ Jesus would overflow. What does overflowing joy in Christ look like? How have you seen it? Experienced it? How would you assess the level of Christian joy in your life?


