





2,000 Sermons Later

2 Corinthians 4:1-6 | Howard Edington preaching

Milestones are important. When a television show celebrates its 100th episode, when an employee celebrates a 25th year of work, or when an organization celebrates 50 years of success, there is usually much celebration and fanfare. These milestones provide opportunity to not only celebrate, but to reflect on the roots and core values upon which success has been built.

In going through some files, Howard and Trisha Edington discovered that today's sermon will be Howard's 2,000th since being ordained as a minister! This milestone is worth joyful recognition, and we thank God for the faithful proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

How does a preacher select a text for a 2,000th sermon? Howard's answer is to return to the text for his very first sermon: 2 Corinthians 4:1-6. Many years have passed since that first sermon, but the Gospel of Jesus remains unchanged.

- Paul begins by noting that the ministry that has been entrusted to him has come through God's *mercy*. In what ways have you received God's mercy? What ministries have been entrusted to you?
- It was because Paul believed that God had given him this ministry that he did not lose heart in the face of opposition. What things cause you to lose heart? How does God's presence and truth provide hope and assurance in your life?
- Rather than resorting to deception to preach and teach, Paul was committed to *setting forth the truth plainly*. In what ways can making things more complicated than needed cause the truth to become less clear? If you were asked to *set forth the truth plainly* about Jesus, what would you say?
- Paul mentions the gospel being *veiled*. How does the gospel become veiled? What are the results? How can it become unveiled?
- Paul notes that the minds of unbelievers have been blinded. Reflect on how you have experienced this. What role can you play in helping people to be un-blinded? What is the role of the Holy Spirit in this?
- Paul said that his preaching is not about himself, but about Jesus Christ as Lord. What does this teach about the role of the preacher? What are the perils of preaching about yourself?
- In verse six, Paul notes that God *made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ*. What does this teach about the process of knowing Jesus Christ as Savior? In what ways do you find God's light in your life? How is God glorified in the face of Christ?
