

Mighty God! John 10:22-39

**DIGGING** DEEPER

Advent is the season when we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ, God's Son, and Savior to those who believe. The coming of Jesus Christ was one of the most anticipated and prophesied events in human history. Most notably, the prophet Isaiah foretold of Jesus when he said in Isaiah 9:6:

For to us a Child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

The Gospel of John captures brilliantly these majestic names of our Messiah and Savior, Jesus Christ. During Advent, we will look at a different passage from John's Gospel, and unpack the glory of the Name of Jesus. Today, we focus on Jesus' encounter with His disciples in John 16:25-33.

- Jesus was the Master Teacher. He gave His disciples just enough about Himself to pique their curiosity, but then they had to cogitate on Him in order to fit the pieces together and truly understand Jesus. Jesus alluded to this in verse 25 when He said, *"Though I have been speaking figuratively..."* In what ways has something Jesus said piqued your curiosity, but you had to work hard in order to grasp it? What are some advantages of having to work out understanding on your own?
- Notice the cause and effect relationship in verse 27. Jesus said, *"the Father Himself loves you because you have loved Me…"* In what ways have you experienced God's love as a result of your loving Jesus Christ? How does this affect the way you related to Jesus? What are the practical implications of God's love in your life?
- The disciples expressed their appreciation for Jesus' clarity and simplicity in verse 29, and this made them believe that Jesus came from God. What convincing proofs can you think of that make you believe in Jesus? What do you think is the most compelling proof that Jesus is the Son of God and Savior of those who believe?
- In verses 31 and 32, Jesus foretold that the disciples would scatter and leave Him all alone. This, of course, happened as He was arrested and crucified. Have you ever scattered from Jesus? What things can make us want to leave Him alone?
- In verse 33, Jesus said, "*I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have peace.*" *Peace* is best understood as much more than just the absence of conflict. It is a state of the soul, which affirms that there's confidence and hope because of God's sovereign will. How would you assess the level of peace in your life? Jesus said, "*But take heart! I have overcome the world.*" Where in your life do you need to *take heart*? What difference does it make to you that Jesus has overcome the world?
