



Witness of the Light

John 1:6-8, 19-28 | Mauricio Chacón preaching

Did you ever ask the question: Where did I come from? Where am I going? What is the reason for my existence? John the Baptist knew the purpose of his life, and he shows us the way to find the answer to these crucial questions.

I. Sent by God

The gospel of John tells us that there was a man sent by God. This is the first response to the question, where did I come from? God has sent us because we have a message to share. We are not in this world to be idle, but to proclaim God's Word. The meaning of being sent by God is even deeper than being created by God. We can see here the concept of authority that has been given to us by God: We have been sent by God to live and to do the will of God. We have not been sent by God to be defeated and without hope. We have been created to live in victory honoring our Creator.

II. To Be a Witness

John came to be a witness of God before his generation. Our generation today is observing us; they want to see if we are really witnessing Jesus Christ, the true Light. Only those who have a real experience with Christ, who have repented of their evil ways, who know that their sins have been forgiven, can testify to the Light. In order to be able to speak on the reality of the Light, first one must experience it. A witness only can testify on what he or she knows, has seen or heard. In the same way, only those that know Jesus Christ in personal form can witness to His light.

III. A Defined Mission

John the Baptist knew exactly what his mission was in life. His concrete goal was that we all be ready for the coming of the Messiah - that we all repent and to prepare the way for the Lord. This should be the intention of every Christian person in order for those around us to be able to believe in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior through our testimony.

IV. He Was Not the Light

John the Baptist was not the true Light, but he had the authority and the power to speak to his generation. He also showed us that no one is in himself the Light, but we are sent to speak of the Light. We can enjoy this authority because it has been given to us. Jesus declares that we are "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). That is to say, Jesus Christ is the Light *through* us. We shine because He shines in our being. The others will be able to get to know Jesus Christ through our life, not because we are or we have something, but because "the light of the world," Jesus Christ, lives in us by His Holy Spirit (Galatians 2:20).

My prayer in this New Year is that we may understand that we are sent by God to be witnesses. We have a mission to accomplish, with an understanding that we are not the Light, but that we only reflect it to others.
