


Corruption and Exploitation

Then John Appears and Announces!




John: The Man

John: The Man

John was a Nazarite, set apart for service to God. Numbers 6



- Nazarites were not to drink wine or strong drinks, nor consume anything having to do with grapes.
- No razor could come upon their heads.
- They could not go near a corpse. If someone died near them, then there was a ritual they must go through involving offering sacrifices as a sin, burnt, and guilt offerings.



John: The Message

1. Judgment is near. Submit to God!

2. Repentance is needed. Confess your sins and change the way you live. Serve others!



How does John describe the Messiah?

- One the who is coming is in a higher position than John. He has more authority.
- 2. He brings the blessing of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. He is the judge.

John's Baptisms

- 2. It is a time of preparation and anticipation.

- 4. God will be fulfilling the long-awaited hope of the Old Testament promise.



Christian Baptism



Jesus is the Living Word.

Scripture is the Written Word.

Preaching is the Proclaimed Word.

Sacraments (Baptism) are the Enacted and Sealed Word.



- Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ. It is a summons to respond in ministry to the world.
- Baptism signifies the beginning of life in Christ, not its completion.
- With baptism we are adopted into the family of Christ.

Being sealed by God's Spirit

Adoption into the covenant family of the Church

Resurrection and illumination in Christ

John 8:12 NRSV


Advent


