



Wo years ago, MDPC provided for its members an incredibly meaningful Holy Week experience. Volunteers from the congregation read the entire Bible aloud in our Chapel—cover to cover, non-stop, from Monday at 6:00 AM until Thursday evening. The Spoken Word is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to read God's Word aloud. Many stories have been told about the blessings experienced through participation. Some people were moved by just reading God's Word aloud; others were especially touched when the passage that came up at their time to read had special meaning for them; still others felt blessed by feeling the love of God as they read together as a family. We hope that each of you—singles and couples, young and old, friends, neighbors, or entire families—will grab this opportunity to participate in an awe-inspiring experience. Any child old enough to read is old enough to participate. God loves hearing from each of us!

If you prefer listening to reading, we especially invite you to share in the blessing of *The Spoken Word* by visiting the Chapel during the readings. Hearing God's Word being spoken by readers dedicated enough to show up at all hours can be a very inspirational experience! The Chapel will be open 24 hours a day while the Bible is being read and can accommodate a great many listeners, so there is no need to register in advance to participate this way. We urge you just to come!

The Spoken Word will begin **Monday, March 30**. There are only so many 15-minute time slots between Monday morning and Thursday evening, so plan to sign up soon!

WORN Pages

Psalm 139 and Ephesians 1, *Who and Whose Am I?* Kristin Huffman preaching

Two of my favorite *Worn Pages* of Scripture are Psalm 139 and Ephesians 1, which both speak of how God has loved and cared for us since before the beginning of time, a message we all need to hear over and over. Life can be difficult and we often find ourselves face to face with trouble, fear, transition, new challenges. Culture has even named several of these times of transition: the terrible twos, teenage rebellion, and midlife crisis. In all three of these times, we are trying to figure out who we are. As we wonder about who we are, we are often led to the deeper questions of who God is and what is the meaning of our lives. One temptation during a time like this is to begin to wonder about God's love for us and even doubt His goodness and grace. My hope this week is to spend time in these worn pages, reflecting on God's great love for us and on how it is in HIM that we find out who we are and what we are living for!

Read all of Psalm 139, paying special attention to verses 13-16. What do you think God is saying here? How might you apply this truth to your life, right now? Meditate on these words, taking in the promise that is expressed in the Psalm.

Then read Ephesians 1 in The Message (if you don't have this translation, you can look it up at www.biblegateway.com). Again, what is God saying here? What message does He have for you in these words?

Today is Confirmation Sunday at MDPC. We have 75 young people being confirmed and taking this important step of faith in their lives. Most of them were baptized as babies and are now ready to say yes to Jesus for themselves. During their Confirmation class they have been discovering what it means to belong to God and God's family. It is our prayer that they will understand more deeply who and whose they are.

Take a moment and think back to your own middle school days (of course, we called in Junior High back then). Try to remember what is was like to be 13-14 years old, on the verge of growing up, wanting to fit in with your friends, beginning to separate from your parents, trying to figure out how to do your life. Scary, right? For most people, anyway.

And so it goes all through out lives: we keep coming up on times of transition, questioning, uncertainty. The Good News is that Jesus has made the sacrifice to forgive us our sins, invited us to follow Him, and promised to be with us always. Reread these passages and lean into the truth that you are God's precious creation who is loved, forgiven, and called. Pray for the Holy Spirit to touch you, way down deep inside, convincing you of whom you are and to whom you belong.
