

DIGGING DEEPER

WHAT KIND OF CHURCH?

Passion Luke 19:1-10 (NRSV) Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson Preaching

The context for Luke 19:1-10 is that Jesus is heading to Jerusalem for the last time. He knows He is going to His death. He is passing through Jericho

before climbing the almost 4,000 feet in about 15 miles to the Holy City. While in Jericho, Jesus takes the time to stop, notice someone up in a tree, call him by name, and go to his house. That someone was Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector. The Roman overseers were smart. They didn't collect their own taxes. They enlisted the conquered populace to collect them. These turncoats were hated; considered unclean; and they would often over-charge their own people and pocket the difference. So, they were rich but despised.

- 1. (From vs. 3 and 4) Why, in your mind, do you think Zacchaeus climbed the tree to see Jesus? What was he hoping would happen?
- 2. Why do you think Jesus noticed him and went to his house? Is there anything in the text that tells you why?
- 3. Who are the "all" in verse 7? Is it the disciples, the crowd, the Pharisees, others? Why are they so mad?
- 4. In verses 8 and 9, Zacchaeus promises something and Jesus proclaims something. If repentance is "turning around and going in the opposite direction," do you think Zacchaeus' repentance is genuine? Why or why not? Is it finished?
- 5. What does it mean when Jesus says, "he too is a son of Abraham"?
- 6. What can we learn from Zacchaeus in this story?
- 7. What can we learn from Jesus? If Jesus' mission statement is verse 10 ("For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost"), how can MDPC carry on that same mission in our day?
- 8. What might your role be in that mission? Pray that God might place a person on your heart or in your path...
