





Faith Alone

Hebrews 11:1-7

Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson Preaching

With the conclusion of our Generosity Series, we return to *The High Five: The Five Solas of the Reformation*. Remember that,

because of what was going on around them, the leaders of the Protestant Reformation had to affirm or reaffirm that we are made right with God (justified) "by grace alone, through faith alone, because of Christ alone." We do not trust in what we have done to save ourselves, but we trust in what Christ has done for us on the cross. But what does *faith alone*, "Sola Fide," really mean? Hebrews 11 is often called "The Faith Hall of Fame Chapter" of the Bible. It fleshes out not only a definition of faith (vs. 1), but also component parts of faith that include aspects from the past, present, and future.

2. In verse 1, the writer defines faith as "the assurance (the being sure) of things hoped for, the conviction (being certain) of things not seen." What does that mean and not mean to you?

3. In my sermon, I suggested that the writer explains what he or she means in verse 1 by the next several verses. Verses 2-5 suggest that one component of faith is learning about the stories, history, and doctrine of the past. In other words, ritual and tradition are part of faith. How are ritual and tradition from the past part of your faith?

4. Jesus instituted certain traditions (like the Lord's Supper), but He cautioned against tradition becoming traditionalism. [Note: I defined *tradition* as the living faith of dead people. I defined *traditionalism* as the dead faith of living people—just going through the motions.] When have you seen a tradition lose its life and become traditionalism?

	How do you stay vigilant against that subtle shift and what can you do to infuse new life into something that has become stale or dead?
5.	In verse 6, the writer says that "without faith, it is impossible to please God, for whoever would approach Him must believe that He exists and the He rewards those who seek Him." The writer has moved from the component of faith that focuses on the past to the component of faith that focuses on the present. What does it mean "to believe that God exists" and "to seek Him"?
6.	How do we embrace the ritual from the past and a relationship with Christ in the present?
7.	In verses 7 and 8, the writer shares that the final component of faith is future oriented. Do you have a clear hope in the future, because of your faith in Christ? Explain.
8.	Which component of faith (past, present, or future) do you need to nurture right now? How will you do that and where can your small group friends help you?
