The most common Hebrew word in the Bible used for "wilderness" or "desert" is *midbar*.

In the OT, this means:

- that which is desolate and deserted, and
- that which is beyond the limits of settlement and government control

The Sinai Desert

How often they rebelled against him in the wilderness and grieved him in the desert! They tested God again and again, and provoked the Holy One of Israel.

Psalm 78: 40-41

TRANSFORMATION

Transformation in the desert and the transformation of the desert are symbols of God's future renewal and deliverance of His people.

"The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom." Isaiah 35:2

TRANSFORMATION

In the NT, the symbolism of the wilderness journey is applied to Jesus in the temptation event, and also to the Church.

REVELATION

In the OT, wilderness is associated with God's revelation of his nature and purposes:


- the Burning Bush
- the pillar of fire and cloud
- manna
- Ten Commandments



REVELATION

In the NT the wilderness is the setting for revelation of the nature and purpose of Jesus Christ:

- Baptism
- Temptation in the Desert
- Transfiguration

Similarity to the Exodus

-wanderings forced by a King

-suffers hunger but without complaint and is fed the "Bread of the Presence (Sam.21:3-6) corresponding to the heavenly Manna

—attacked by enemies in the wilderness

David in the Wilderness

Spiritual as well as physical trial

—tempted to imitate Saul's arrogance and cruelty


—tempted to seize the throne instead of awaiting the Lord's deliverance

—refuses to seize what can only be received as a gift

JESUS' TEMPTATION IN THE WILDERNESS

Lasts for 40 days, the Israelites wandered for 40 years

Jesus answers first temptation with quotation from Deut. 1-6 "Man shall not live by bread alone"

Jesus answers second temptation by affirming "You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve. Dest. 6: 10-15

Jesus answers third temptation with Deut. 6:16 "You shall not tempt the Lord your God."

-From Luke 4: 1-13

Parallels between Jonathan and Jesus

He laid down his rights — 1 Sam 18: 1-4/ 2 Cor. 8:9

He laid down his life—1 Sam 20:30-33/John 15:13

He interceded—1 Sam 19:1-6/ Rom. 8:33-34

He encouraged—1 Sam 23:15-18/ John 14:26
