
Anointing of Objects

# Objects were anointed for holy purposes.



So early in the morning Jacob took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up for a pillar and poured oil on the top of it. Genesis 28:18

You [Moses] shall also anoint the altar of burnt offering and all its utensils, and consecrate the altar, so that the altar may become most holy. Exodus 40:10





Samuel anointed Saul (1 Samuel 10:1) privately and David (1 Samuel 16:13) before his family. David was anointed by the people publicly by the tribe of Judah (2 Samuel 2:4) and by the elders of Israel. (2 Samuel 5:3)

# Anointing of People


Anointing covered the head or body with oil which was oftentimes aromatic. It was done for healing (James 4:14), personal hygiene (Ruth 3:3), or as a religious ritual.

The oil was a symbol of the Spirit of God and one of its uses was to invest someone with God's power.

It was a ritual of inauguration designating a person for a holy purpose or specific office consecrated by God.

The anointing of Saul marks Israel's new monarchy as a divine institution.

Anointings found in Scripture



Aaron anointed to the priesthood. Exodus 29:7 The high priest was called the "Anointed Priest." Leviticus 4:3-15.

1 Samuel 24:6 indicates that the king was the "Lord's Anointed." The Hebrew word for this became Messiah. The Greek word became Christ.



Anointings found in Scripture

Jesus was anointed by a woman/Mary days prior to Passover. Matthew 26:1-5, Mark 14:3-9, John 12:1-11

Peter in Acts 10:38 says, "how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power." Thus Christ is the King who would rule forever.



Why are we exploring Wisdom?

In the comparison of Saul and David, we see Saul in need of wisdom. His heart needed a defibrillator. David, although not perfect, sought wisdom.



### What is Wisdom?

Wisdom is the ability to think and act utilizing knowledge, experience, understanding, common sense, and insight. Knowledge is just the accumulation of facts.

Wisdom brings life and folly brings destruction.

Where do we find Wisdom?



Yahweh possessed wisdom before the creation of the world (Proverbs 8:22-23). *Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!* (Romans 11:33)

In Christ are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge (Colossians 2:3).

Where do we find Wisdom?



Proverbs teaches the reader how to cope with life through observation, patience, self-control, and fear of the Lord (Proverbs 1:6).

Discipline is a required companion to wisdom. Seeking wisdom for our life without using discipline is worthless.




#### **#1 We must desire it!**

Take my instruction instead of silver, and knowledge rather than choice gold, for wisdom is better than jewels, and all that you may desire cannot compare with her. Proverbs 8:10-11

Wisdom is more valuable than wealth. It is precious and desirable. Its goodness is based on its incomparable value in life.



#### #2 You we go to God to find wisdom!

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction. Proverbs 1:7 (also see 9:10)

Fear is reverence to God. Submission to God's will is characteristic of a true worshipper. Fear is the discipline which leads to wisdom.



#3 We must go with humility and submission!

When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with the humble is wisdom. Proverbs 11:2 (also see Proverbs 15:33, 26:12, 28:11)


Pride is the feeling that shows that we do not feel insubordinate to God.



#### #4 We must be teachable!

Listen to advice and accept instruction, that you may gain wisdom in the future. Proverbs 19:20 (also see 9:7-9 and 10:8)

A wise person is willing to be transformed and has an attitude open to learning.



**#5 We must be studious!** 

An intelligent heart acquires knowledge, and the ear of the wise seeks knowledge. Proverbs 18:15 (also see Proverbs 10:14)


Wise people continue to learn. The wisest person knows how little he/she knows.



#6 Living in community, we seek together!

Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm. Proverbs 13:20

We need to associate with wise people and examine who is influencing you.



**#7** We must look to Christ for wisdom!

And because of him [the Father] you are in Christ Jesus, who came to us wisdom from God... 1 Corinthians 1:30

It is only in listening to Jesus that we hear the truth. Wisdom comes from Jesus.
