God and People

- God wants exclusivity. God is intolerant of idols. (Exodus 20:2-3)
- God is true to God's Word. God said that King Ahaziah was going to die and he did.



- Elisha is the bearer of God's power and wisdom. Wisdom is from God and is available to believers.
- Yahweh is the God of Hope. God is faithful and will not abandon us. When Elijah goes, God remains with Elisha.

2 Kings 2:1-18 (Elijah is taken up)

God is sovereign, powerful and filled with grace.



- God can thwart the plans of the enemy.
- God provides unseen protection awaiting God's command to act.

2 Kings 6:8-23 (Army)

- God continues to love Israel and keeps the covenant despite Israel's infidelity.
- God keeps God's promises. Judah had its 3 victories as indicated by the 3 arrow taps.

2 Kings 13:14-15 (Arrow Taps)

 God listens to God's people. God heard Josiah's cries of repentance and delayed disaster.

> 2 Kings 22:1-20, 23:1-25 (Josiah)

What do we know about People from our study?



Humankind is sinful - both then and now.

In 2 Kings, we see God's people sinking into darkness. God allows the people to be overtaken by foreign powers. This is a consequence of their sinful behavior.




What do we know about People from our study?

In Romans 7:18-24, Paul talks about his own sinfulness but ends with:

Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin. Romans 7:25 ESV

How Can I be Invitational?

1. Pray first.

ight

Ask God to put on your heart the right person(s) to invite to Bible Study. Ask for a "can do" attitude. Ask for wisdom and the words you'll need.

2. Rely.

Rely on the power of the Holy Spirit to give you what you need.



How Can I be Invitational?

3. Prepare.

Write down what you might say to another person. How has Bible Study affected or touched you? Why do you like Bible Study?

How Can I be Invitational?

4. Recognize & respond. Note the opportunities

God has given you and act.

5. Be conversational.



Chat with the person about everyday life and let them know that you are interested in them as a person. If it's someone you don't know well, talk to them several times before asking them to join you. Be a good listener.

How Can I be Invitational?

6. Follow up.

Follow up with an email or text message putting the time and place in writing. "Do you want to ride together on that day?"




7. Follow up again.

After Visitor's Day, follow up again with a call/email/text. "Is there anything else you need to know about joining our Bible Study?" or "If you missed Visitor's Day, come another time."
