

- The central service of the church is all about the broken body, the shed blood of Jesus



HOW DO WE KNOW WHAT HAPPENED IN THE INTERTESTAMENTAL PERIOD?

- Some Apocryphal books
- Latin Historians
- Scattered Greek References
- Works of Josephus, 1st century Jewish historian

PERSIAN EMPIRE

- Persian Empire controlled Israel at time of Nehemiah's rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls: 444 BC
- Persian Empire conquered by Greeks under Alexander the Great in 331 BC
- Alexander wanted to unify the ancient world under the Greek language, philosophy and culture

DIVISION OF GREEK EMPIRE

- Alexander dies 327 BC
- Kingdom divided between his generals
- Palestine at first controlled by the Ptolemy dynasty of Egypt—annexed 320 BC
- In 198 BC Palestine comes under control of Antiochus III, who ruled the Syrian empire

SIGNIFICANCE

- Antiochus III wanted to Hellenize the Jews
- In response, Pharisees rise up to preserve their Jewish traditions, to be zealous and obedient to every aspect of OT law

THE ABOMINATION OF DESOLATION

- In 175 BC, Antiochus Epiphanies believed he was a God
- Made Sabbath observance, circumcision and possession of Hebrew scriptures capital crimes
- Sacrificed a pig to the god Zeus on the altar of the Temple in Jerusalem
- Daniel 9: 26-27 and Matthew 24:15-16

MACCABEAN REVOLT: 174 BC

HASMODEAN RULE

- Simon Maccabeas, one of the Maccabbean brothers, became a military commander and high priest after the revolt
- Simon expelled the Syrians
- Simon became a hereditary ruler and began a period of Palestinian independence

- The Hasomeaneans began fighting among themselves after about 75 years of rule
- Pompey, a Roman General, offered to mediate
- SURPRISE! Pompey settled the disputes by conquering the area and in 63 BC Israel came under the domination of Rome

ENTER THE ROMANS



LIFE UNDER ROMAN RULE

- Jews generally fared well
- Romans gave them a lot of independence and respected their religious customs
- Rome appointed Herod in 37 BC as a puppet king
- Herod was a great builder and in 20 BC began a reconstruction of the Temple in Jerusalem on a large scale

MESSIANIC EXPECTATIONS

- Essenes expected a messiah who was both military leader <u>and</u> a priest who would reform the Temple.
- Pharisees believed the messiah would remove Rome, the foreign invader
- Sadduccees had no messianic expectations—they limited their cannon to the Torah
